From 2-6 April 2018, the third round of the intergovernmental negotiations on the Global Compact for Migration (GCM) takes place in New York. The current draft contains important references to actions Member States may take to address drivers that compel people to leave their countries and to address the protection needs of people moving across borders in such contexts.
