Plenary Sessions

- Adoption of the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration
- Opening Statements: President of the Conference, UNSG, PGA, a representative from the migrant community and a representative from the private sector.
- Heads of State or Government, ministers and heads of delegation attending the Conference will be able to make formal statements
- Time permitting, statements from representatives of IGOs, multi-stakeholders.



Dialogues (Action on commitments, Partnerships and innovative initiatives)

- Two separate interactive Dialogues on 10 and 11 December respectively
- Open for Member States and multi-stakeholders
- Include a keynote speaker and three panelists each
- Structured around the 23 GCM objectives
- Focus on inspiring examples of actions, measures, policies and approaches to GCM implementation

iii. Side events (5-9 December 2018)

- **Coordinating Committee:** OSRSG for International Migration, GFMD Secretariat and IOM, in support of the Host Government
- Aim for high-level participation
- Inclusion of head of states, VVIPs, cross-regional partnerships, global/regional representatives of multi-stakeholders, global/regional representatives of NGOs, or global/regional representatives of international organizations.
- Aim for high impacts on outcomes that relate to GCM implementation (e.g. bilateral/multilateral agreements, new commitments on migration).
- Avoid duplication, encourage a broad spectrum of issues to be covered.

B. From now to December



i. GA side event on migration in New York (September)

OSRSG will help to organize a side event on “**Enhancing regular migration**” to:

- 1) galvanize participation at the Intergovernmental Conference at the highest political level, including Heads of State or Government, and
- 2) build a bridge between the end of the negotiations in July, the high-level segment of the General Assembly in September and the Conference in December



ii. Network & Framing Conference in Geneva (October)

- To establish the new United Nations Network on Migration (to be held in Geneva in mid-October)
- The Secretary-General has decided to establish this Network to support Member States' implementation of the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration
- Aim to formalize the Network's terms of reference, composition, working groups, and workplans
- The Network will be formally launched in Marrakech



iii. Preparations for the two Dialogues in Marrakesh (July-November)

- The topics for the Dialogues are: Promoting action on the commitments of the GCM; and, Partnerships and innovative initiatives for the way forward
- The OSRSG is preparing two separate concept notes to support the preparations of the two dialogues to be circulated at the end of September
