

**Third informal interactive multi-stakeholder hearing**  
**Preparatory process for the global compact for safe, orderly and regular migration and the intergovernmental conference on international migration**

**18 December 2017**

**Trusteeship Chamber, UN Headquarters, New York**

**Theme:**

The third multi-stakeholder hearing will focus on the importance of a whole-of-society approach to migration at the local and national levels. A whole-of-society approach to migration has been often cited in the discussions on the global compact for regular, safe and orderly migration, recognizing the importance of involving different actors in policy-making and implementation. The practical implications and concrete examples of successful cooperation and partnerships merit further attention.

The hearing will provide an opportunity for participants to discuss the need for cooperation and partnerships between different segments of society, including civil society, the private sector, diaspora communities, migrants, local and national authorities, schools, academia and others to develop and implement a coherent and whole-of-society approach to migration.
