The Migration Governance Indicators (MGI):

- is a capacity-building tool to enable states examine and strengthen their governance of migration;
- identifies good practices and areas in need of further development;
- helps to clarify what well-governed migration looks like in practice – including as stated in SDG target 10.7
- could be used to develop baseline assessments and conduct future reviews in the context of the SDGs and a Global Compact for Migration (GCM).

The event will be an opportunity to discuss how the MGI can support implementation of a GCM, once adopted.
