I am writing with regard to the schedule of the informal thematic sessions in the context of the preparation for the Global Compact on migration.

As outlined in the workplan, shared with Member States through your letter, dated 13 April 2017, the sixth informal thematic session on "Irregular migration and regular pathways, including decent work, labour mobility, recognition of skills and qualifications and other relevant measures" is scheduled to take place at the United Nations Office in Geneva on 3 and 4 October 2017.
