In accordance with paragraph 13 of resolution 71/280, the precise modalities of the intergovernmental conference on international migration are to be decided by Member States by January 2018. The letter of the co-facilitators informs Member States of the proposed timeline for the negotiations on the modalities resolution for the intergovernmental conference. I encourage Member States to adhere to the proposed timeline to ensure timely consideration of potential budgetary implications in the 5th Committee during its main session.



We are pleased to write to you in our capacity as co-facilitators to lead the intergovernmental consultations and negotiations on issues related to the global compact for safe, orderly and regular migration, the intergovernmental conference, as well as their preparatory process.

As outlined in paragraph 13 of resolution 71/280, Member States will need to decide on the precise modalities of the intergovernmental conference on international migration to take place in 2018.

We take this opportunity to inform Member States on the proposed timeline for the negotiations on the modalities resolution for the intergovernmental conference to adopt a global compact for safe, orderly and regular migration, outlined in the attached roadmap. A zero-draft of the resolution will be circulated in the beginning of the week of 25 September 2017, and informal consultations will follow in accordance with the proposed schedule. As always, further details related to these informal consultations will be announced in the UN Journal in due course.
